Thirteenth W&M Faculty Show presented by the Muscarelle Museum of Art

WILLIAMSBURG, VA – Recent works of the teaching studio art faculty including visiting instructors and emeriti professors of The College of William & Mary will be featured in an exhibition **Faculty Show 13** at the Muscarelle Museum of Art from September 12, 2015 through January 17, 2016.

Faculty Show 13 will highlight the diverse talents of the William & Mary studio instructors in a variety of media including drawing, painting, printmaking, sculpture and ceramics. And this year, photography will be included to highlight works by faculty of the newly developed photography program within the Department of Art & Art History.

The College of William & Mary was the first American university to create a department of fine arts and the Muscarelle Museum of Art was the first accredited university museum in the Commonwealth. This exhibition, a long-standing collaboration between the two departments, will showcase representations of each artist's current studio works. Aaron De Groft, Director of the Muscarelle Museum of Art, explained, "As a university museum two of our goals are to utilize the museum as a laboratory for learning and to collaborate with the faculty of The College. This exhibition provides us the opportunity to do both."

The Muscarelle Museum of Art is located on Jamestown Road on the campus of The College of William & Mary in Williamsburg, Virginia. The Museum is open from 10:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. Tuesday through Friday and 12:00 noon until 4:00 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday. The Museum is closed on Mondays. Docent tours are available at 1:00 p.m. on Saturday, Sundays, and other times as announced.

There is an admission fee of \$10 which includes admission to all exhibitions. Admission is free for Museum members, The College of William & Mary faculty, staff, and students, and children under twelve.
