Fourteenth W&M Faculty Show presented by the Muscarelle Museum of Art

WILLIAMSBURG, VA (September 20, 2019) – Recent works of William & Mary’s studio art faculty, including visiting instructors and *emeriti* professors, will be featured in an exhibition **Faculty Show 14** at the Muscarelle Museum of Art. This exhibition will run from October 4 through October 27, 2019.

Faculty Show 14 will highlight the diverse talents of the William & Mary studio instructors in a variety of media including drawing, painting, printmaking, photography, sculpture, ceramics and installation art.

William & Mary was the first American university to create a department of fine arts and the Muscarelle Museum of Art was the first accredited university museum in the Commonwealth.

This exhibition, a long-standing collaboration between the two departments, will showcase representations of each artist’s current studio works.
